OUR STRATEGIC PLAN PRIORITIES 2024-2026

Our 2021-2024 strategic plan, which ended in April 2024, was created using feedback from our 2020 community survey. Rather than developing a new strategic plan during our building project, we extended it to 2026 and added some strategic projects. 




